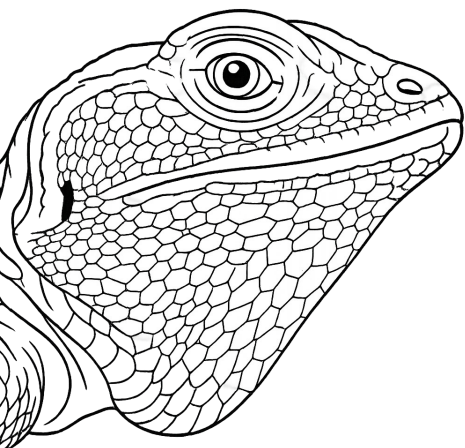
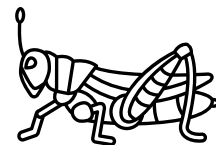
WILDLIFE FACTS

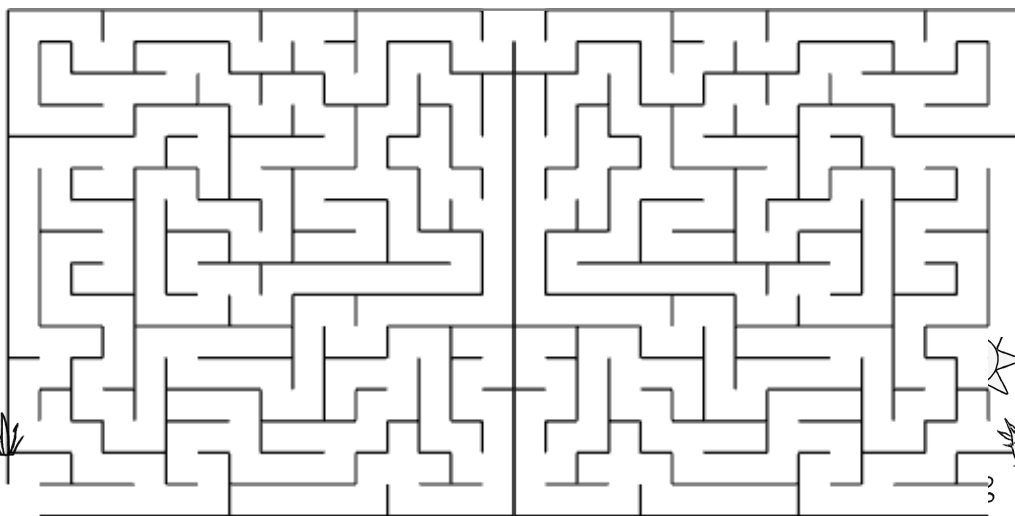
